

Much of the growth in our friendship and later relationship, was due to a ballroom dancing group I participated in all through high school, and finally roped Nathaniel into as seniors.


Almost immediately after graduation - and to no one's surprise - we began dating, as being just friends simply didn't cut it anymore.

Megan is adept at turning a house into a home, and loves to entertain guests. We both


have a heart of hospitality; having people over to enjoy each others' company








This is Felicity!


Our Pets

Our neighborhood also has three little lakes, private for residents, and with one just a short walk from our house, it's a dream to think that our kiddos will get to grow up on the water.





Our Future


